Liz Richardson

On April 5, 2010, the Lexington Community Foundation lost a long time friend, donor, volunteer, Board member and Advisory Board member. On that day, **LIZ**

RICHARDSON passed away in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

She was an active volunteer in Community Concert Association, P.E.O, and the Arts Council during her time in Lexington, Nebraska. Besides being instrumental in the success of the Foundation Thanks-A-Million campaign almost 15 years ago, Liz was a regional employee of Community Concerts.

The Foundation created the Liz Richardson Community Service Award in 1999 to honor Liz for her time and dedication to many projects in our community. The scholarship, which recognizes an individual's demonstrated exemplary volunteerism in our community, was first awarded in the spring of 2000. In a note to the Foundation, Liz remarks, "The scholarship in my name was such a surprise and thrill. I couldn't be more pleased!" Liz Richardson named the **LEXINGTON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION** as beneficiary to her IRA account. Upon her passing, the distribution was made to the Foundation to permanently endow this scholarship in her name.

Brian Eilers

The **BRIAN D. EILERS** family has established a scholarship in loving memory of Brian who passed away September 15, 2009. Brian was a lifetime resident of Dawson County. He graduated in 1975

from Overton Public High School and went on to pursue a dream of having his own business. Eilers Machine & Welding, Inc. is located in the Industrial site of Lexington, NE. Brian was an innovative businessman who loved the challenges of using his hands to create things. Not only was his business a service to the community but he also built equipment that protected our country.

Brian encouraged young people to go after their dreams. He understood the importance of education and the benefits of continuous education in order to achieve those dreams.

Upon his death, the family directed memorial gifts in his name to the **LEXINGTON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION** for the creation and permanent endowment of the Brian D. Eilers Memorial Scholarship Fund. One scholarship, valued at \$2,000, will be awarded annually to a Dawson County High School student or a college student who graduated from a Dawson County high school. Emphasis will be given to a student that has either a parent(s) or a grandparent(s) who work or have worked for Eilers Machine & Welding, Inc. If no student applies that is connected to Eilers Machine & Welding, Inc. employment, the next consideration will be for a student who is focused on a technical or engineering degree pursuing a post secondary education. The scholarship was awarded for the first time this spring by Brian's wife Anne to Overton High School senior Claire Houser.

FOUNDATION GRANTS

Grant Awards Provide Support

The Foundation distributed \$178,665 in grants from July 1, 2009 - June 30, 2010 to support the Lexington area. The Foundation awards grants throughout the year from its *unrestricted funds*. Unrestricted funds are those gifts and donations given to the Foundation for use at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

CFI: Lexington**(Community Fitness Initiative) \$10,000**

Match grant with Tri-County Hospital in support of this initiative directed toward improving healthy lifestyles of Lexington youth.

Library Program Initiative \$7,500

Match grant funding for community programs hosted by the Lexington Public Library.

Grand Generation Center \$3,750

Funding in sponsorship of the *World Famous Platters* concert, a social and fundraising event to raise money for a new electronic sign at the center.

Lexington Softball Program \$575

Pass through grant funding from the Nebraska Softball Foundation for the purchase of new equipment for the City of Lexington softball programs.

Lexington Parks & Trails Fund \$59,251

Grant funding from Key 2010 is added to the fund created in support of City of Lexington's Parks & Trails comprehensive plan to improve Lexington's green spaces.

DC Parent Child Center \$3,500

Grant proceeds used for demolition and removal of the car port at the facility.

Youth Bowling Assoc. of Lexington \$600

A grant to support the Youth Bowling Association of Lexington to offset program costs.

Johnson Lake Trails \$25,000

A match grant in support of the new segment of trail at Johnson Lake. Grant funding was provided as a distribution from Key 2010 event.

Lexington Baseball Association \$10,000

A support grant to the American Legion baseball program in Lexington. Grant funding will be used to partially pay for a new Legion Scoreboard and ice chest at the Rec Complex concession stand.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance \$3,000

Program grant funding to purchase new laptops, a laser printer and supplies to assist tax preparation service for low-income families in Lexington.

Back Packs for Kids \$4,000

Funding in support of the Lexington Public Schools initiative implemented at the elementary school level. The Back Pack for Kids program is designed to meet the needs of hungry children at times when other resources are not available, such as weekends and school vacations.

Lexington Alternative Education Program \$1,035

In support of the quilt rack and rope barricade stand class projects conducted at the Dawson County Historical Museum.

Two Rivers Health \$1,500

Funding in support of bringing speaker Dr. Walt Larimore to Lexington.

Lexington Post Prom \$500

Grant funds supported the after prom activities sponsored by the parents.

Plum Creek Community Players \$500

A program grant in support of the PCCP's production of *Leading Ladies* which was performed on the LMS Auditorium stage February 2010.

Somali Community Center \$3,000

Seed grant funding to support the integration services provided to immigrants and refugees.

LMS Auditorium \$6,596

Grant funding from the permanent Thanks-a-million Auditorium Fund for lighting upgrades in the auditorium.

Lexington Chamber of Commerce \$3,000

Grant funding to support Plum Creek Days concerts and activities.

Legal Aid of Nebraska \$1,500

A grant in support of the creation of a Lexington office location and the free legal service provided to Lexington residents.

Optimist Rec Complex \$33,858

LCF Board of Directors directed distribution of Key 2010 proceeds in support of the ball field expansion and creation of the new soccer addition at the complex.

PERFECT KICK!

The Lexington Hispanic Men's Soccer League has come a long way since 1991 when a few men, employed at Tyson (IBP), started playing soccer in their back yards. Two soccer teams formed and played one game on Sundays. As more men showed interest in playing, they had difficulty organizing and finding suitable places to play the game. They used grounds at St. Ann's Parish Center, the high school and IBP, but as their group grew, so did their need for good soccer fields.



Their dream is coming true. The Hispanic Men's League has worked closely with Joe Peplitsch, the city, and the LCF and have helped in building new soccer fields north of the Optimist Recreation Complex. The first adult men's league games were played on August 22, 2010. They have two more goals of assisting with an indoor soccer facility and helping Lexington youth with soccer. The men's league has established a fund within the LCF.

KEY BRIEFINGS



Key 2010 brought in a record \$234,000, bringing the total raised from all nine events to \$1,480,095. The proceeds from the Lexington Community Foundation's Key event are intended to have wide-spread, immediate impact in this community. From 2002 to 2010, \$1.16 million has been disbursed in support of projects and initiatives in the Lexington area.

The Key event is held each spring and *everyone* is invited to participate.
