These foundations are public charities since they develop broad support from many unrelated donors with a wide range of charitable interests in a specific community. A community foundation has an independent board that is broadly representative of the public interest and it maintains a diverse grants program that is not limited in scope. In addition to making grants, community foundations often play a leadership role in their communities, serve as a resource for grant information and facilitate training and technical assistance for local nonprofits.

LEXINGTON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION is proud to be included in the list of top giving foundations in Nebraska. This list is derived from The Grantsmanship Center’s funding data bases and includes both corporate giving foundations and community foundations. Based on this information, LCF is seventh – just behind corporate giants Union Pacific and Con Agra.

TRIBUTE TO WES LUBBERSTEDT WES MADE LASTING CONTRIBUTIONS TO THIS ORGANIZATION AND ITS MISSION

The Foundation owes its success and accomplishments in great part to the stature and contributions of its board members - both past & present. We have lost several former board members in the past year. Most recently was Wes Lubberstedt.

Wes served as a volunteer on the **LEXINGTON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION** board of directors for 27 years. During that time, he served two separate terms as president from 1991-1993 and 2005-2007.

While his contributions on the Executive and Development Committees were invaluable, it is his contributions to the structure of the organization that are most notable. In 1998, Wes offered office space for the Foundation to set up a permanent office. The law office and LCF shared that office space for the next 14 years and shared administrative staff for eight years. In 2012, LCF purchased the building - 607 N. Washington St. remains the permanent address of the **LEXINGTON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION**.

LCF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Foundation's Board structure includes Board & Staff Development, Development, Events, Finance & Investment, Grants, Public Relations and Scholarship committees. Every board member volunteers on at least one committee.

The Executive committee meets monthly and is comprised of the organization's officers and the chair person of each of the other committees. Their role as individuals is to report on their committees' activities and ideas and those of our patrons and, as an Executive committee, to make recommendations to the full board based on those reports.

Board of Directors & Executive Committee

The board of directors and the executive committee manage the business affairs and finances of the foundation. Twenty-five voting directors are elected to serve four-year terms at the annual meeting each July. The board of directors meets six times a year, and the executive committee meets monthly to conduct business. Each board member serves on at least one standing committee.



Board & Staff Development Committee

This committee ensures effective board processes including committee development, board composition, nominating procedures, and new member orientation and training. Recently added to the responsibilities of this committee are issues relating to LCF paid staff. The committee, as needed, will review job descriptions and be responsible for recruitment of new staff.

The grants committee is responsible for developing the organization's grant procedures and initiatives. The committee also reviews all funding requests and makes recommendations to either Executive Committee or the full board.

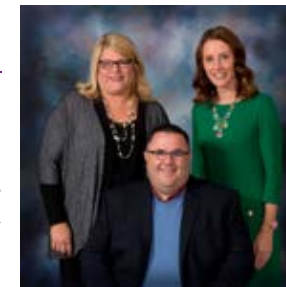

In April of 2017 the **LEXINGTON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION** hosted the 16th annual Key event. Because of your generosity we raised nearly \$320,000, bringing the accumulative total of all Key events to \$3.8M.

LEXINGTON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION works to promote positive change for our community through annual events. We use the proceeds from these events to grow our community, expand programs and create initiatives that encourage even more participation from citizens. 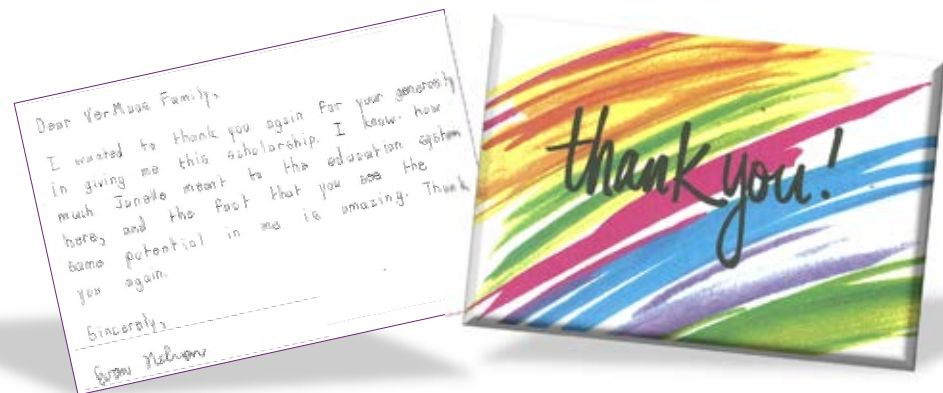
